Shall the Board of Education of Box Elder School District, Utah, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$220,000,000 and to mature in no more than twenty one (21) years from the date or dates of issuance of such bonds for the purpose of raising money for constructing buildings, acquiring land and furnishings and remodeling and updating existing school property, under the charge of the Board, and, to the extent necessary, for providing moneys for the refunding, at or prior to the maturity thereof, of general obligation bonds of the Board authorized hereunder or heretofore issued and now outstanding?

The Board currently property taxes to pay debt service er outstanding general obligation that have been issued to finance approved projects. The incremental ty taxes would decrease upon the ment of the currently outstanding , but the decrease will not occur if oposed bonds are issued. Taking ccount the repayment of the inding bonds, the Board expects that suance of the proposed bonds, in the er currently expected, will result in an ated tax increase in the amount of ximately \$238.27 per year on a ry residence with the District average of \$450,000 and of approximately 23 per year on a business or dary residence having the same which is equal to \$19.86 per month primary residence and \$36.10 per on a business or secondary nce. The foregoing is only an ate and is not a limit on the amount of that the governing body may be ed to levy in order to pay debt service bonds. The governing body is ted to levy taxes to the extent led by law in order to pay the bonds.
