SUGGESTIONS AND TIPS FOR COMPLETING YOUR HOME INVENTORY

While there are several things you can do to prevent being the victim of theft or burglary, even the most vigilant will fall prey to the criminal element. That is why it is so important to keep a record of your valuables. By maintaining a household inventory, you not only increase the odds of recovering your stolen property, but you also assist police in apprehending the subjects responsible. Maintaining a current inventory allows you to easily access the necessary information needed to file a police report or an insurance claim. This information also proves valuable if your residence has been impacted by a disaster such as a fire or a flood.

Focus on recording high end valuables that are most likely to be stolen. (TVs, gaming systems, laptop computers, Ipods/MP3 players,

DVRs, cameras, jewelry, tools, lawn mowers, snow blowers, bicycles, guns, etc.)

Use the "remarks" area on the form to note pertinent characteristics of the item which would prove useful in identifying your property. (Item color, unusual markings, etc.)

Attach receipts of items to the form. Mark the receipt with the corresponding item number listed on the form.

Make your valuables less attractive to a thief by writing your street address and zip code on them with an engraver or a permanent marker. Don't forget to mark your CDs, DVDs, and video games with a permanent marker.

Photograph unique possessions such as antiques and jewelry. Attach photos to the inventory form. Mark the photo with the corresponding item number listed on the form.

In an effort to conduct a thorough inventory, don't forget to inventory items kept in closets, drawers, the attic, the basement, the garage, the shed, and/or automobile trunks.

Keep two copies of your inventory list and receipts. (Hidden in your home, a safe deposit box, your workplace, with a trusted friend or family member, etc.)
